

The Bill Maschke Scholar-Athlete & **Burt German Memorial Service Awards**

The SJISA is pleased to present this award in the memory of Bill Maschke, an outstanding scholar, swimmer and coach here in South Jersey. A \$500 scholarship will be awarded to a maximum of four males and four females from the senior class that are chosen by a special maximum of four males and four females from the senior class that are chosen by a special committee from a pool of qualified applicants whose coaches have submitted transcripts, meet sheets and other supporting documents. To be considered, an applicant must have carried a minimum cumulative 3.7 GPA (on a weighted 4.0 scale) through seven semesters of work and have participated in 80% of the team's meets during the season. The committee evaluates the criteria based on a point system approved by the general membership and the award's winners are selected out of the pool of qualifying finalists by the committee. A maximum of four runner-ups for each gender will each receive a \$100 award.

The Angela Hallerud Newcomer of the Year Award

This award will be presented annually to memorialize the life of Lenape swimmer Angela Hallerud by honoring any team member in their first year of high school swimming (regardless of grade) that positively-influenced the culture of his/her team by fostering team unity and the collective achievements of his/her teammates. The winner each year will receive a plaque and a money gift from the Hallerud family.

Giancarlos Mateo Absegami High School

Gian is a junior here at Absegami and it is his first time swimming. He joined this new sport due to the team's inclusivity and reputation for good sportsmanship, along with having a few swimmers that keep us competitive with tough teams as well. Our team at times has a difficult time getting swimmers to take on that challenge since we practice at 5:00 am and the sport as you know has its own physical challenges that are tough for any athlete. However, Gian's challenges were different, his biggest challenge is that Gian is hearing impaired.

Upon joining the team, we secured our A.S.L. interpreter for our meets and after school activities, but there was no way she could make our morning practices. Gian can hear slightly with cochlear implants, but being in a pool, he would not get any help from them at practices. Therefore, the school administration and others were worried about how Gian would learn this new and always challenging sport. Everyone was worried except Gian that is.

We first needed a plan. Luckily, a slew of team managers, volunteer coaches, parents, and fellow swimmers would write coaching instructions on mini whiteboards throughout practices to advise Gian. Two teammates of his have taken some A.S.L. in school and at home and brushed up on their A.S.L. to help, as well as sharing the signs with coaches and teammates. After a while, advising Gian along with the team became normal and easy. Gian struggled for weeks, but by January he began to cut time, do several events in meets, and was passing fellow swimmers in practices. At no place was it clearer that Gian was not only part of the team, but also establishing an improving culture of inclusivity on it than at our meets.

Absegami had some incredible meets this year. Two ties, two single digit losses, two wins by 2 points, and a lot of close ribbon winnings races in invitationals. It seemed like every meet was greeted with excitement and some really loud pool decks. One of the loudest people on the deck often standing next to me was the boy who could not hear it. Gian was the first to congratulate a kid on a great swim, acknowledge someone cutting time, and being proud of his own improvements meet by meet. By season's end nothing made our culture feel more joyous than seeing hundreds of fans on the pool deck wiggling their fingers in the air high and proud for Gian finishing relays and then greeted with high fives by teammates. This wonderful vision continued to fill swimmers, coaches, parents, and opponents with the joy that only swimming can give you at an athletic event. This young man, through his bravery, kindness, and hard work, brought smiles and happiness to an unspeakable amount of people across South Jersey this season, and probably has little knowledge of his impact. It is my hope that this award can give him some semblance of the difference he has made for so many. Coach Winkler

The History of the All-South Jersey Teams

In 1978, the South Jersey Swimming Officials selected and honored the first All-Star team. From 1978 to 1980, only one team of honorees was named and honored by the Courier-Post. From 1981 to 1986, the paper listed both an All-Star team and a group of honorable mention swimmers. In those early days, the main criteria for choosing the team was the results from the NJSIAA's "Meet of Champions", now called the Individual State Championships.

In 1987, the paper published a first, second and third team of honorees for the first time. The main criteria remained performance at the NJSIAA meet but as the SJISA Invitational and the various conference and league championships evolved, times from those meets began to also be considered for the teams' selections.

As the number of meets increased, the SJISA voted in 1991 to select its teams solely on the basis of all electronically-timed results achieved at any championship or playoff meets. Today, the organization is proud to note that the fifty-six athletes whose performances have placed them on these pages represent every swimming league in South Jersey, making them teams truly worthy of the title "All-South Jersey".

The Swimmers of the Year **Audrey Derivaux** Haddonfield Memorial High School

Audrey started her swimming career at Haddonfield Memorial High School in historic fashion. Audrey as a freshman won two individual state titles in the 200 IM and the 500 freestyle. Her times of 1:55.73 in the 200 IM and 4:44.10 in the 500 free both were Haddonfield records, NISCA All-American cuts and MOC records. Audrey's 200 IM time didn't just break the MOC record by 2 full seconds but also broke Alex Walsh's 13 - 14 girls national age group record.

Audrey didn't just have success at MOC's but consistently throughout the season. Audrey was the single biggest factor in Haddonfield winning its 5th consecutive Group C state title. During our playoff run Audrey went 52.52 in her 100 butterfly, setting another Haddonfield record and getting her 3rd NISCA All-American cut. At our state title meet, when Haddonfield was down 6 points, Audrey anchored the 200 free relay jumping in about a second behind and split 22.34 to secure the win for Haddonfield in that event. Audrey then immediately swam the 100 backstroke, winning that event, and her time (55.27) was another NISCA All-American consideration. To close out the meet, Audrey anchored the 400 Free relay jumping in over a second and half behind and split 49.27 to win that event and the meet for Haddonfield.

Lastly, the best part about Audrey is that she is equally as impressive out of the water. Her mindset of "getting it done at all costs" is something to be marveled at. She is selfless in how she is willing to swim whatever, whenever if it means that it will help our team. Audrey isn't just focused on her own swims but is behind the blocks cheering for her teammates. She helps with cheers and even as a freshman has already become a true leader of our team.

What is awesome is that this is just Audrey's first chapter of being a high school swimmer. We as a staff are very proud of her work ethic, and cannot wait to watch her grow. Our Girls Swimmer of the Year of the year is Audrey Derivaux. Coach Wister

Raekwon has never been the kind of swimmer to seek the spotlight, always willing to swim whatever events the team needed, and quietly pushing himself every day to make the Tartans proud. Without being asked, he has shouldered the responsibility of leading our team, no small task when you are simultaneously training and competing both locally and internationally.
