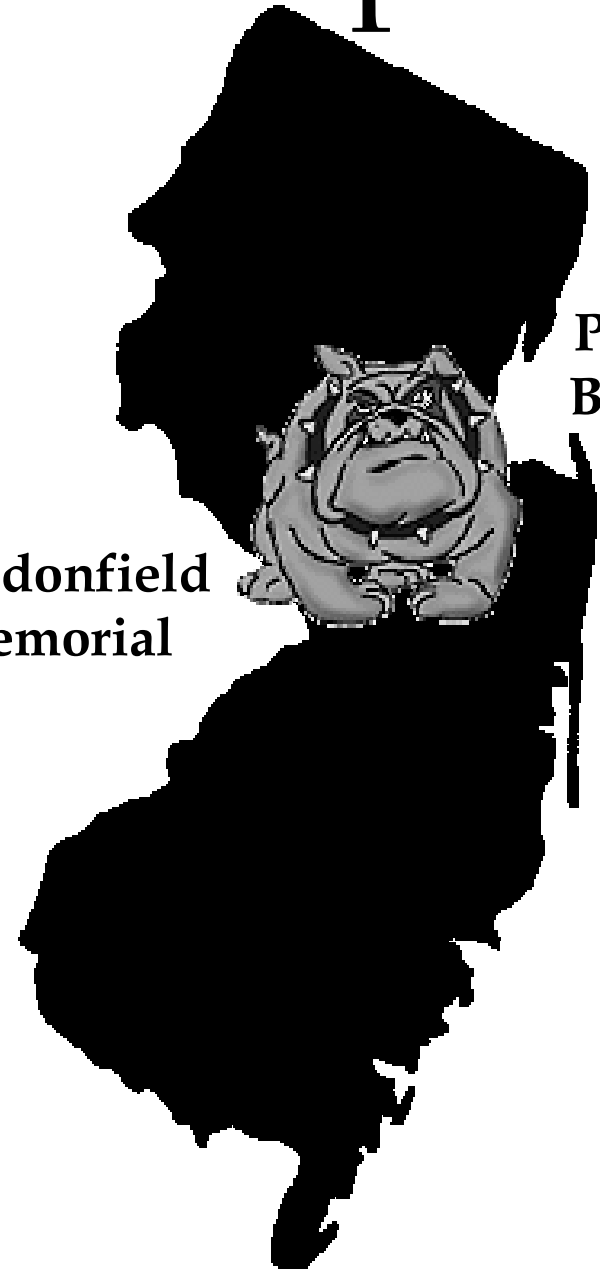

The 2010 Bill Maschke Scholar-Athlete Awards

The SJISA is pleased to present this award in the memory of Bill Maschke, an outstanding scholar, swimmer and coach here in South Jersey. A \$500.00 scholarship will be awarded to a maximum of four males and four females from the senior class that are chosen by a special committee from a pool of qualified applicants whose coaches have submitted transcripts, meet sheets and other supporting documents. To be considered, an applicant must have carried a minimum cumulative 3.7 GPA (on a weighted 4.0 scale) through seven semesters of work and have participated in 80% of the team's meets during the season. The committee evaluates the criteria based on a point system approved by the general membership and the award's winners are selected out of the pool of qualifying finalists by the committee.

Erika Esposito is a junior at Gateway who came out for the Gateway/Woodbury Swim Team this season. She had no previous swim experience, but she came to the first day of practice with the attitude that every coach loves to see: a smile on her face and a willingness to learn. The first couple of practices were pretty difficult for Erica. She did not have a great feel for the water, and she was overwhelmed by all the new information that she was being confronted with. However, she was a multi-sport athlete who was trying something new at a late stage in her high school career, and she was ultimately able to compensate for her lack of knowledge and experience with her natural athleticism and her willingness to listen and take in and process information.

The look of wonder and interest on Erika's face never really completely faded over the course of the season. Each time when she swam, she would run over to the coaches to get her time, and even little improvements thrilled her. It was a joy to coach this young lady this year; she improved steadily and was grateful for each tenth of a second that she managed to improve. Her attitude was overwhelmingly positive and refreshing, and the coaching staff was possibly even happier than Erica when she dropped time because we had the opportunity to celebrate along with her.

All of the training and competition improvements shown by Erika did not, however, equal the contributions that she made to team chemistry and team morale. Erica was one of our loudest and most vociferous sideline cheerers, even though she would often only swim once during the entire meet. She joined the team with a group of her friends, but she immediately opened that circle of friends to include the whole team. Her optimism and enthusiasm are so genuine and passionate that she is hard not to smile around, and her smile and laughter were a gift that she presented to her teammates virtually with every lap and with each and every bus ride. Finally, Erica was excited to see improvements in not only herself but also in others. She never resented when one of her teammates beat her time; she was always happy for them but also motivated to improve herself, so Erica was also a source of positive feedback and friendly competition on the team. Erica made it "cool" to work hard in the end lanes of practice and she was a source of constant fun rivalry among her teammates to improve.

Each season it is fun for the coaches to chart the physical and social/emotional progress of the newest group of swimmers on the team. The contributions of Erica Esposito accelerated the improvements of that new group of swimmers- the kids that had never been on a team before and that needed the most coaching and input. I genuinely feel that the Gateway/Woodbury Swim team will be a better team next year because Erica Esposito took a chance and came out for the team her junior year. I anticipate that she will be a candidate for team captain next season, and that the circle of friends that she grew and improved with will end next season with very high swimming IQ's.

The History of the All-South Jersey Teams

In 1978, the South Jersey Swimming Officials selected and honored the first All-Star team. From 1978 to 1980, only one team of honorees was named and honored by the Courier-Post. From 1981 to 1986, the paper listed both an All-Star team and a group of honorable mention swimmers. In those early days, the main criteria for choosing the team was the results from the NJSIAA's "Meet of Champions", now called the Individual State Championships.

In 1987, the paper published a first, second and third team of honorees for the first time. The main criteria remained performance at the NJSIAA meet but as the SJISA Invitational and the various conference and league championships evolved, times from those meets began to also be considered for the teams' selections.

As the number of meets increased, the SJISA voted in 1991 to select its teams solely on the basis of all electronically-timed results achieved at any championship meets. Today, the organization is proud to note that the fifty-eight athletes whose performances have placed them on these pages represent every swimming league in South Jersey, making them teams truly worthy of the title "All-South Jersey".

The 2010 Ray Hegel Award

This award may be presented annually by the South Jersey Swimming Officials Association in memory of Ray Hegel, one of the greatest officials to ever work in South Jersey. Since Ray officiated at every level as his children progressed from Tri-County through to the US National Team, the award was instituted to honor the area's outstanding swimmers or divers from any level of competition.

Tiffany Malatesta

Vineland High School, Class of 2006

University of Pittsburgh, Class of 2010

Tiffany Malatesta began her swimming career competing for the Dolphin Swim Club in the Suburban Summer League and as an age-group swimmer representing the club program at GCIT. But it was during her high school years at Vineland High School under coach John A. Casadia, Jr. that her career took shape. Tiffany won 12 state titles during her high school swim career in the MOCs. She anchored the 200 and 400 freestyle relay and swam the backstroke in the 200 medley relay. She also won the 100 freestyle at MOCs during her sophomore year. In 2002-2005, she led her VHS team by winning the NJSIAA Team State Championship three years in a row. Tiffany was named the girls swimmer of the year by the South Jersey Coaches Association and The Philadelphia Inquirer. Tiffany also received both NISCA Academic and All American Swimming honors for her efforts at Vineland High School. Along with three of her teammates, Tiffany set The NISCA National Girls Metric Record in the 200 Freestyle Relay which stood for several years.
